The programme provides opportunities for families to learn together at drop-in workshops, as well as offering artist-led workshops for children. We also work with partners to take part in a wide range of events throughout the region, such as heritage days and festivals.

Hours

These will vary according to the events programme. The events take place in school holidays and on occasional weekends. Volunteers can choose which events they would like to support. Event times can vary between two-hour drop-in sessions to full days.

We also hold regular team meetings to plan and evaluate our family learning programme along with other learning teamwork.

Training

New volunteers will shadow someone from our Learning Team in order to gain experience in how our events run. All workshops have activity sheets outlining each activity. There will also be the opportunity for relaxed learning about the collections and temporary exhibitions on display and in our archives.
