

Education: School Workshop Leader & School Workshop Assistant

Hours

These will vary according to school bookings. The schools can book for a morning, or up to a whole day and there may be set up and pack down time required. Schools tend to come between 10am – 3pm.

We also hold regular team meetings to plan and evaluate school workshops alongside other learning teamwork.

Training

New volunteers will shadow someone from our learning team for each of the workshops they would like to be involved with. Opportunities are available to then gradually lead parts of a workshop. All workshops have staff sheets outlining each activity. There will also be the opportunity for relaxed learning about the collections and temporary exhibitions on display and in our archives.
